Tribal Freedom Fighter

Rana Poonja Bhil

Rana Poonja Bhil, a brave commander from the Bhil tribe of Merpur, Rajasthan, played a pivotal role in India's freedom struggle. As a key figure in the Battle of Haldighati on June 18, 1576, he led Bhil archers alongside Maharana Pratap, fiercely resisting the Mughal army on the banks of the Banas River. Their skillful use of slings and stones created a hailstorm-like defense, forcing the Mughals to retreat. In recognition of his unmatched courage and leadership, Maharana Pratap honored him with the title 'Rana'—a tribute to his strength and valor that still echoes in the Vananchal of Mewar.



Rani Durgavati

Rani Durgavati, born on 5th October 1524 in Kalinjar, Bundelkhand, belonged to the Gond tribe and stands as an immortal symbol of bravery in Indian history. Known for her valor and strategic acumen, she defeated Sher Shah Suri even before her marriage, and later, as the Queen of Garhamandal, defeated Baz Bahadur twice. In 1564, when faced with a Mughal invasion, she chose death over surrender, courageously ending her life on the battlefield. Her sacrifice on June 24th became a testament to the indomitable spirit of tribal leaders in the defense of freedom and identity.

Shraddhanjali

Prof Dr. Shankarrao Tatwawadi, also known as Shankar ji hailed from Nagpur. Born in 1933, he was a swayamsevak since his childhood. A meritorious student throughout his educational career, he received his early education and obtained M.Sc. in Chemistry from Nagpur University after which he went to Banaras Hindu University BHU for his Doctoral studies. Further, he went to USA Univ of Texas at Austin and University of Kansas in mid-1960's for his Post-Doctoral studies.



He joined Banaras Hindu University in the department of Pharmacy and served as Head of Deptt of Pharmacy till he took early retirement in 1992.

He was associated with sangh activities all through this time and held various responsibilities from shakha level at Nagpur and prant level at Banaras and served as shishak in sangh shiksha vargas. He was instrumental in establishing Hindu Swayamsevak Sangh HSS shakahas in USA and was vistarak there for some time. He also travelled to countries like UK occasionally for programs while continuing his Professorship at BHU. .

He was assigned as pracharak for UK in 1989 where he stayed till 2011. He became Vishwa Vibhag samyojak in 1993 and travelled in more than 60 countries. Some of the major programs that started in this period are Vishwa Sangh Shiksha Varg, Vishwa Sangh Shibir, Hindu Sangam at Milton Keynes UK, Hindu Marathon UK etc. The shakha work outside Bharat witnessed major expansion in all continents during this time.

After 2011, he was associated with Vijnan Bharati as a margadarshak and travelled throughout Bharat guiding karyakartas and meeting prominent personalities in that field.

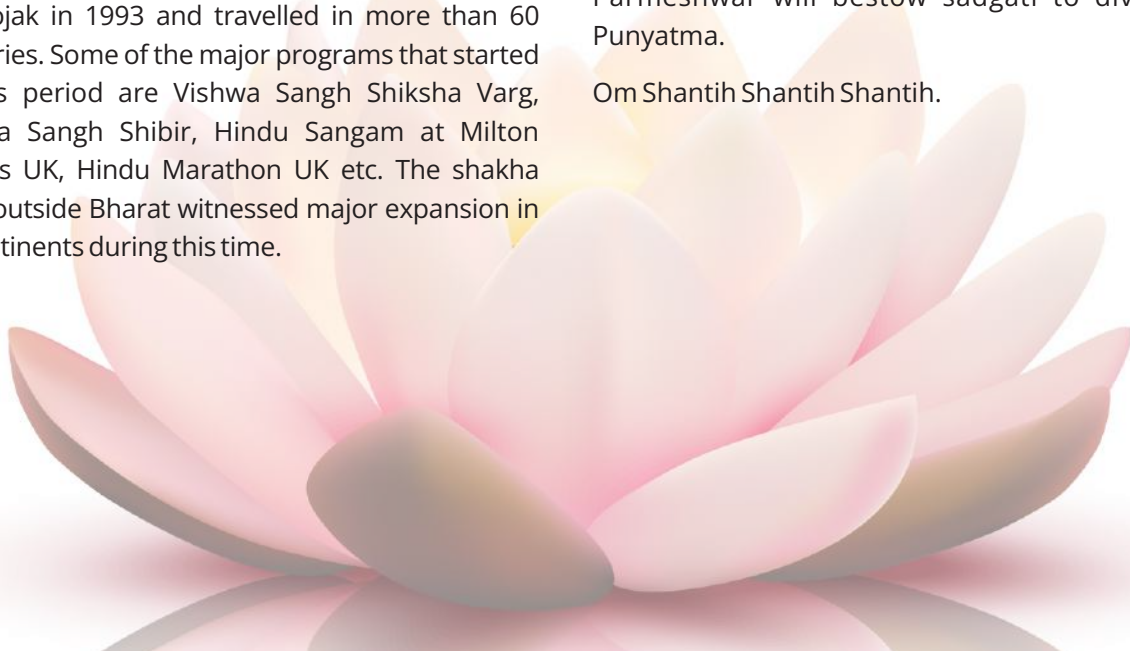
Known for his affable and down to earth nature, he kept contact with innumerable karyakartas and their families all around the world. It was astonishing how he could remember names of everyone in the family and would enquire about everybody.

He had a very keen eye on details, be it travel details, Sanskrit words and its meaning, tune of the geet, chronology of programs etc. He was well versed in Sanskrit and Hindu scriptures and was a good singer.

He was based at Dr Hedgewar Bhavan, Mahal karyalay Nagpur since 2011 and any karyakarta visiting Nagpur would yearn to meet Shankarrao ji. He was unwell for last few months and had some difficulties in walking. He passed away on 12th March at 1030 at Mahal karyalay. As per his wish, his mortal remains were handed over to AIIMS Nagpur on 12th March evening.

Our heartfelt shraddhanjali to the pious soul of Shri Shankarrao ji and prayers that Shri Parmeshwar will bestow sadgati to divangat Punyatma.
